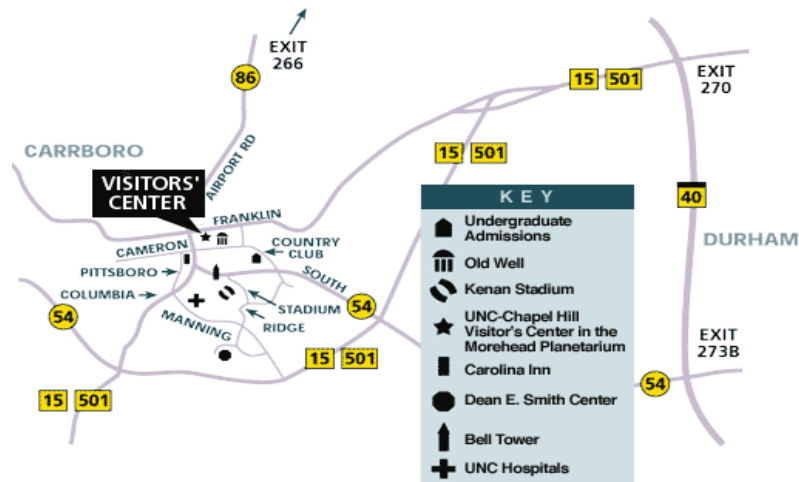


Approaches to Campus



If you're driving to Chapel Hill:

via US 15-501 (from Sanford and points south)

- At the 15-501/NC 54 Bypass at the south edge of town, continue straight across the exchange onto S. Columbia Street
- Follow S. Columbia Street into campus
- Turn left onto W. Franklin Street
- Turn left into the first Granville Towers parking lot entrance (immediately following the entrance into the University Baptist Church Lot)

via Interstate 40 (from Raleigh and points east):

- Take Exit 273-B (Hwy 54) towards Chapel Hill
- Continue straight for 4 miles to the top of the hill
- Turn right onto Country Club, then straight through the stoplights onto Cameron Avenue.
- Turn right onto S. Columbia.
- Turn left onto W. Franklin Street
- Turn left into the first Granville Towers parking lot entrance (immediately following the entrance into the University Baptist Church Lot)

via Interstates 85/40 (coming from Charlotte, Winston-Salem, Greensboro):

- Take I-40 East towards Raleigh
- Take Exit 266 and turn right at the end of the exit ramp
- Continue straight on MLK Blvd. for 4 miles to Franklin Street
- Turn right onto W. Franklin Street
- Turn left into the first Granville Towers parking lot entrance (immediately following the entrance into the University Baptist Church Lot)

via Interstate 85 North (from Durham and points north):

- Follow I-85 to intersection with Hwy 15-501 South
- Follow 15-501 South towards Chapel Hill; get into the right lane shortly after you cross I-40
- Merge (bear right) just after Erwin Road onto Franklin Street
- Continue on Franklin Street up the hill to Columbia Street
- Just Past Columbia Street, Turn left into the first Granville Towers parking lot entrance (immediately following the entrance into the University Baptist Church Lot)

NOTE: due to construction at the former University Mall, you may access Granville Towers East **ONLY** off of Franklin Street, and **ONLY** via the lane adjacent to the University Baptist Church parking lot.
