

Scholarship Information

UNC Music Workshop

July 23 – July 29, 2017

Thank you for requesting information on scholarships to the *UNC Music Workshop*. We believe that this event can be a defining experience in your life and congratulate you for your wisdom in seeking such opportunities.

There are a limited number of partial scholarships available to support the participation of students in the *UNC Music Workshop*. Scholarships are awarded in the form of a partial waiver of fees for commuters or residents, and are intended to cover approximately 25 - 30% of the total cost in either category. Monies for these scholarships, however, are dependent on the largesse of internal and external sources and the funding available varies each year. For this reason, although we do our best to honor all requests, the *Workshop* is rarely able to exceed the 30% funding policy, and on some occasions support has been limited to the 25% level. Scholarships are awarded on a first-come-first-serve basis. Students who need or want a scholarship are encouraged to aggressively seek support in their community early in the Spring, through civic organizations, churches, school booster groups or arts patrons, in addition to applying for a *Workshop* scholarship.

Following are the guidelines for Workshop scholarships:

1. The initial deposit must be paid (according to deadlines and policies on registration form) in order to qualify for a scholarship.
2. Auditions in the form of a CD, DVD or an MP3 file (or other attachable media file) must be submitted no later than June 9, 2017. A letter of recommendation must accompany all audition submissions from a teacher who can speak to your *talent, work ethic, perseverance* and *need*. If you apply for a scholarship via email, please attach your letter of recommendation along with your MP3. Sorry, it is not possible for DVD/CD's to be returned.
3. Scholarship recipients will be notified by June 23, 2017.
4. Final balance (less the scholarship amount) is due by July 7, 2017.
